Regarding the note found under Table 2 that reads “**2 doses; includes immunocompromised women 18-26 years,” a clarification is necessary. This statement is not intended to imply that immunocompromised women only receive 2 doses of HPV vaccine in Québec. Indeed, *Santé et services sociaux Québec* states on their website that “For both teenagers and adults, three doses of vaccine over a six-month period are recommended for proper protection¹.”

This note is also not meant to imply that Québec only considers high-risk women nor that it is the only province that will consider the HPV vaccine for select high-risk populations. The intricacies of vaccinating high-risk individuals are beyond the scope of the current article. As considerable research and provincial policy change has taken place during the publication process for the current article, the reader is encouraged to consult the Public Health Agency of Canada’s website for up-to-date information regarding provincial schedules for routine and high-risk immunizations^{2,3}.
